What is Camp Herrlich and the CLA program?

In 1922, Camp Herrlich was founded with one goal in mind, helping children and adults experience enjoyable, safe, educational, high quality, recreational, retreat and environmental educational programs.

Today, we are as committed to that goal as we were in the beginning. At Camp Herrlich we believe that what one does in life must be carried out in a manner consistent with respect for the individual and concern for the Earth. We emphasize this philosophy in everything we do.

The Cooperative Learning Academy, (CLA), was created to satisfy a need in the local high school for a safe, healthy, and supportive setting for a group of students who were struggling in the school environment.



What does this program offer to students?

CLA is an alternative program providing students educational and therapeutic experiences in a non-traditional setting. Our goals are to improve student attendance and performance during their morning classes at the high school or BOCES program. We are also providing a venue where students will hopefully develop positive ways to express themselves and apply newly acquired skills when interacting with peer groups and outside pressures.
